Problem/Opportunity: Within the framework of the IODE capacity development programme, UNESCO's International Oceanographic Data and Information Exchange (IODE) Programme is required to create the foundations for implementing local monitoring programmes and improving the application of appropriate and up-to-date oceanographic methods and technologies, from face-to-face workshops covering basic topics in ocean observation through to a case study of an important need in capacity development according to a regional network of member states.
